I'm putting up a mister system for my piggies...Crystal at VegasPigPets is using outdoor misting fans....Suey at Lil' Orphan Hammies has a cemented in wading piggy pool, complete with sloped ramp, with a pipe in the middle to fill the pool when you turn on the water, Pumba in Mississippi mommas made a piggy pool by using a large kids plastic pool, cutting the sides down so it's not too tall for the pigs to get in and out of, and then covered the plastic pool edges with pool noodles cut lengthwise to fit over the cut edges to protect the bellies. The pool noodles are held

lengthwise to fit over the cut edges to protect the bellies. The pool noodles are held in place with duct tape-piggy cooling inventions at their finest!!! Jerry, Peggy Wimberly's husband, used hog panels to create an arched shade area!! He took the panel, stood it up lengthwise, secured the short side edge with rebar, bent the tall end over, and secured that with rebar. This created an arch that he then covered with shade cloth!!! 





Shadow & Buddy - Tornado Survivors

Editor's Note: High winds and tornadoes broke out across the state of Oklahoma May 31, 2013 followed by severe flooding. The National Weather Service reports the May $31^{\frac{st}{2}}$ El Reno, Union City, tornado as an EF-5 with a width of 2.6 miles wide, making it the widest tornado ever documented. EF-5 is the highest possible rating for tornadoes on the Enhanced Fujita scale. Low level winds were measured at 296 miles per hour. The National Weather Service said some of the sub-vortices had a forward movement of up to 180 miles per hour. Since the tornado remained over mostly open terrain, damage was minimal in comparison to its intensity. Overall, the tornado was responsible for 8 fatalities and up to 115 injuries. This tornado was double the width of the May 20, 2013 tornado in Moore, Oklahoma which killed 24 people, including 10 children. The following is a true story about a family and their two potbellied pigs that could have not survived, and certainly should make us stop and think what is really important in life. This family lost their home and both vehicles, but thankfully they survived through the loss and damage. ~ by Peggy W.



SHADOW IN HIS CAST

May 31, 2013: PDS (Particularly Dangerous Situation) Tornado Watch in effect until MIDNIGHT tonight. This was the lead story on the Morning News stations that day. My name is Shadow. I am a 1.5 year old black pot belly pig, my Mom and Dad (Cindy and Jeff) adopted me from Hamalot Farms. My big brother's name is Buddy, he is a white pot belly pig, and let me tell ya, he is the boss of this back yard.

On May 31, 2013, I learned to fly. I did not want to and I don't care to do it again. Let me tell ya, it is WAYYY overrated. Buddy and I were just grazing in the back yard, rooting up some grub worms and such. Weather for the most part that day was nice, just a little humid. Mom and Dad came and gave us dinner around 5:45 p.m. and it was yummy, except I noticed the sky was getting kinda dark and the wind was getting pretty crazy bad. Buddy and I discussed it for a few minutes. We thought - well it

is Oklahoma and it is spring, so a dark sky this time of day is not so unusual. Buddy decided he was full and needed a little nap, so he wondered into Dad's work shop. We like it in there. A few minutes after 6 p.m., all kinds of things started happening. The wind was now blowing like something I had never experienced. I decided to run to the work shop too, might be a good idea to get out of this wind and now rain and hail. Oh crap, the door to the work shop is closed and I can hear my brother calling for me, but I can not get in.

Next thing I know, the wind is so hard and the rain and hail are pelting me. I just want to get out of

Next thing I know, the wind is so hard and the rain and hail are pelting me. I just want to get out of here. As soon as I had that thought, I began to fly the wind had picked me up and had put me in the air. I felt like I was in the Wizard of Oz house. The next few hours I don't remember.

At around 1:30 a.m, I heard my Dad calling for me and I could see a light criss-crossing the field, but I

At around 1:30 a.m, I heard my Dad calling for me and I could see a light criss-crossing the field, but I was so tired and I tried to get up to go to him and my left front leg would not allow me to get up and go to him. I couldn't even call to him I was so weak from flying. I could tell he was about two hundred yards from me and I just could not go to him.

At around 8 a.m., I woke up and tried to get up, I forced myself to get up.... let me tell ya, that hurt. I had dislocated my shoulder during my flight. I just wanted to go home and crawl in my straw-filled house and tell Buddy about my flight. I just wanted to go home, so I decided I would do my best to handle the pain and head towards where I had last saw and heard my Dad.

Then I heard it, I heard my neighbor, Kenneth's voice (I like Kenneth, he brings me all kinds of treats). He was calling for me and he was calling for my Dad. Then I heard my Dad...... I don't think I have ever been so happy to hear my Dad call my name! Dad came to me and loved on me and then he realized I was hurt. Awe, he was so sad about that.

When Dad had got me home, I heard him tell Kenneth that I must have been at least 200 yards away from our house. I heard them discuss, something about the storm came out of the West and I was at least 200 yards West of the house. I heard Dad say the storm must of carried me 200 yards or more. I tried to tell him nothing carried me anywhere, I FLEW!!

Buddy was still in the work shop and I could hear him being pretty upset and asking about me. Mom and Dad and some of their friends got me in the work shop with my brother. I never was so happy to see him and for the first time in his life, he was overjoyed to see me. When the two of us saw each other, it was like getting a strawberry shortcake! Best treat of my life was seeing him again (please do not tell Buddy that, he already has a big head). We laid down and talked and talked and talked about the night before. Buddy told me how the wind came in and blew the door shut on the work shop. He told me about how the holes got in the workshop walls, he told me about how he was hit by debris that came thru the holes, he told me how he watched parts of the roof fly off and how the rain and hail came in and got the shop floor all wet. He told me how the noise was just unreal, he told me that he loved me and I told him how I loved

him. I told him that the next time I hear someone say "when pigs fly" I am going to say "I alréady did.'

The third person my Mom called after the storm was Tracy McDaniel of Hamalot Farms. Buddy and I kinda need to be in a fenced in area and I needed some medical attention. Tracy came and got us and took us to her place for awhile. Tracy made sure my shoulder was looked at and Buddy's cuts were taken care of as well. I had a dislocated shoulder and had to have a cast put on and let me tell ya, I didn't like it one bit. The second cast they put on, I took off. I have to be able to get in the swimming pool, it is summer time. Buddy and I and our Mom and Dad are very thankful and lucky to know Tracy.

UPDATES: (from Cindy) Our home that we have worked on for the last few years is unlivable, but yet we both feel very very blessed. We have been able to salvage a lot of what was inside. We totally lost stuff that was in two rooms. One room was a storage room and the other was a spare bedroom that I had most of my stuff in. I lost a lot of my mother's stuff in those rooms and a lot of stuff in the storage room. Jeff lost almost all of his tools and such. Insurance has totaled both of our cars. My brother and his wife drove from Colorado and brought us an RV to stay in. We had no TV and we had no internet. With money donated, we were able to purchase a small TV so that we could at least watch the weather. We feel honored to share our story. Buddy and Shadow are amazing guys. We finally got paperwork from the mortgage company and have decided to build a house. Jeff wants to build a small 600 sq. ft. cottage and then save up and start building a larger house in the next year or two. Our mobile home has been removed from our land and we are very busy still working and cleaning up. Shadow is doing great. He decided after his second trip to OSU that he was done with doctors, casts and car rides for now. He got out of the new cast 30 min after getting home. He's running and playing in the mud and pool at Tracy's. Once I knew our fence was gone and there was no way we could keep the boys here right now, Tracy was the one person I knew, even if she had no room, she would find somewhere to put them until we could care for them properly again. Tracy is an amazing lady that is for sure. She cleaned out her spare bedroom and made it a recovery room for Buddy and Shadow. We actually adopted Shadow from her last year. Tracy has a great place for pigs that she rescues all the time. When we first got Buddy, I searched for someone in Oklahoma to ask about how to take care of him and I came across Hamalot Farms. 

Extraordinary Pigs



MEISHAN

(excerpt from pages 52/53/106 of the book: Extraordinary Pigs. SCAMPP has these books for sale. ONLY 7 LEFT - "Extraordinary Pigs" displays an enormous variety of swine, 38 types in total. Breeds from around the world are featured in the book - from the United States, England, Wales, Austria, Belgium, Hungary, New Zealand, China, Vietnam, Africa, Indonesia, and the Philippines. Page Count: 112, Cover: Hardcover with jacket, 120 Beautiful Color Pig Photographs - nearly every page has beautiful color pig photos. Suggested donation: \$10)

This Chinese pig is one of the breeds found in the region around Lake Taihu, which is located in north central China, where the climate among the lakes and valleys is mild. With

its sagging spine, low belly, wrinkled face, and the long drooping ears of a lop rabbit, it suggests a shar-pei puppy crossed with a hippopotamus; it moves with the lethargy of Eeyore in the Winnie-the-Pooh stories.

However, the Meishan has recently been of great interest to Western breeders due to the fact that the sows have exceptionally large litters. They have sixteen to twenty teats, and it is normal to have the same number of piglets, often twice a year. Litters of thirty to forty can occur, but this is rare.

Unfortunately, although the meat tastes good, it also has a high percentage of fat. Before health concerns over cholesterol, this was not considered a problem, but since the 1980s, attempts have been made to bring the fat to lower levels without losing the prolificacy. This has involved breeding the Meishans with Western pigs.

In 1989. Meishan, Fengjing. and Minzhu pigs were shipped to the University of Illinois and to Iowa State University for crossbreeding experiments. Meanwhile, Britain's Pig Improvement Company was working with Meishan specimens. In Britanny, the French company Pen Ar Lan used both Meishan and Jiaxin, combining them with a synthetic boar line based on three Western breeds. Subsequent breeding included Landrace, but went back and forth between Meishan and European pigs until they arrived at a good sow line, which they call the Naima.







NO-BAKE SUGAR FREE STRAWBERRY PIE ~ from Pillsbury.com

A sugar free strawberry pie is very easy for you to make. You make it with sugar free strawberry flavor gelatin, and add strawberries to it. However, the trick is to make the gelatin with Diet Sprite or 7-up instead of water. With a little bit of cornstarch in the mixture, it is also thicker. You can set the mixture in the fridge, and then put it into a regular pie crust, one that you have made yourself or one that you have purchase already made. This type of dessert needs no baking, which makes it even easier to create.

STRAWBERRY TIPS:

To keep strawberries fresh twice as long - If you mix up a solution of water & vinegar (1/10th vinegar, to 10 parts water), and rinse your strawberry's in it, they will keep twice as long. You won't taste the vinegar, because it's such a little amount. Enjoy. ~ from Susie Mills

How to hull strawberries - if you don't have a strawberry-hulling tool, you can simply use a straw and push the straw through the bottom tip of the strawberry and it will push the green cap right off; that way you don't have to cut the caps off. ~ (idea from Walmart you tube video)

NO-BAKE CRANBERRY COCONUT BARS ~ from Pillsbury.com

This is a microwave cookie that can be mixed right in the baking pan. How's that for convenient? If you are not fond of dried cranberries, consider substituting dates, raisins, or chopped apricot pieces in this recipe.

1/2 cup butter

1/2 cup brown sugar

1 1/2 cup quick rolled oats

1/4 cup light corn syrup

1/2 cup dried cranberries

1/2 cup sweetened flaked coconut

1/2 cup walnut pieces

Directions:

- 1. Place butter in an 8-inch square, microwave-safe baking dish. Microwave until the butter is melted.
- 2. Stir in the brown sugar until dissolved. Stir in the rest of the ingredients. Press the mixture firmly into the dish.
- 3. Microwave for three to five minutes or until lightly browned. If your microwave does not have a rotating carousel, rotate the dish twice during cooking.
- 4. Let the cookies cool and then cut them into bars with a sharp knife.

This recipe will make sixteen 2×2 -inch squares.



EASY CUCUMBER PICKLES

1 C. vinegar
1/4 C. water
1/2 C. sugar (or more if desired)
1 Tsp. salt
Sliced cucumbers
Sliced onion (Optional)

Heat the mixture just until the sugar is dissolved. Pour over sliced cucumbers and onions. If desired add a sprinkle of mustard seeds or pepper flakes. Make in the morning and eat that evening. They will keep for up to a week.

DILL PICKLES...use the same method, just add 1 tsp of dill seeds, or several dill leaves, along with two cloves of peeled garlic.

WATERMELON PICKLES

3 pounds white portion watermelon rind, cubed

5 cups sugar

2 cups cider vinegar

1 cup water

1 Tbsp. whole cloves

1 Tbsp. whole allspice

3 cinnamon sticks, 3 inches each

1 lemon, sliced

Put watermelon cubes in a large pot with enough salted water to cover. Soak overnight. Drain. Cover with fresh, cold water and bring to a boil. Cook over low heat until tender. Drain. In another large pot, combine sugar, vinegar and water. Tie cloves, allspice, cinnamon and lemon in a cheesecloth bag. Add to sugar mixture and stir over medium heat until mixture boils. Boil 5 minutes. Add watermelon cubes and simmer until translucent, about 15 minutes. Remove spice bag and pack pickles in hot, sterilized jars. Refrigerate 2 weeks before using. Makes 4 quarts.

CROCKPOT LEMON ROSEMARY CHICKEN ~ from Susie Mills

Thaw and skin whole chicken
1 head of garlic, separated, peeled, leave whole
2 lemons, sliced thin
A bunch of fresh rosemary

After skinning the chicken, rub the inside and outside with salt and pepper, and put in the crock-pot. Put several cloves of garlic inside and sprinkle the rest over the outside of chicken. Put some lemon slices on the inside and place the remainder of them all over the outside. Wash rosemary sprigs, leaving them on the stem, put some inside the chicken and place the rest all over the outside. DO NOT ADD WATER OR ANYOTHER LIQUID. Cook on low for 8 to 10 hours. This recipe can be eaten as is or shredded and used for Burritos, in white bean chili, or salads.

(Frozen Treats even your pigs can have)



Cheerios® Frozen Banana Popsicles

2/3 cup Yoplait® 99% Fat Free creamy strawberry or creamy strawberry banana yogurt (from 2-lb container)

3 cups Cheerios® cereal

4 firm ripe bananas

8 craft sticks (flat wooden sticks with round ends)

Line cookie sheet with waxed paper. In shallow dish, place yogurt. In another shallow dish, place

Kiwi Pineapple Popsicles

1 whole pineapple, (peeled, cored and chopped)
2 tablespoons clover honey

6 ripe kiwi (peeled and sliced), reserve 10 kiwi slices

Combine pineapple chunks, honey and kiwi (except 10 slices of reserved kiwi) in a blender and process until you have a smooth mixture. If you prefer a chunky consistency, pulse until you reach the perfect consistency.

Add 1 kiwi slice to the bottom of each popsicle mold. Tip mold to side (to allow kiwi to stay on side) then pour mixture in molds, cover with aluminum foil and add popsicle sticks. Freeze according to manufacturer's instructions. It's best to freeze at least 12-24 hours.

Run under warm water to loosen popsicle. Serve and enjoy.
