PRESIDENT REPORT

Happy Fall ya'all. Yes, it's almost pumpkin time and our piggy friends love pumpkins, and it's so good for them too. No need to cook them, they like it raw and they like the whole thing. The only fruit I de-seed (new word), is apples because I was told that apple seeds are hard for pigs to digest.

I received a call a couple of weeks ago from a gal that had just moved here from Arizona, that owns a four year old "mini" pig. She was calling to get some information about SCAMPP and the Southern California area. I was asking her questions about her "mini" pig and I explained to her that SCAMPP doesn't agree with that term. I went on to explain to her that what the breeders are telling people about feeding to keep their pigs small is not a healthy option. Her pig weighs 45 pounds and she's four years old. All she is feeding her is lettuce... just lettuce. Needless to say, I tried to explain to her about the importance of potbellied pig pellets, for their all around health and their bone health. I just can't believe what these breeders are telling people... they must not care at all about the pigs.

After that call, I did some research and this is what I found. As a rule, in non-breeding adults, feed about 1/2 cup of pig pellets per 25 lbs. of the pigs weight. So a 75 lb. pig would get 1 & 1/2 cups of food, and should be divided into 2 meals per day (our pigs weigh about a 125 lb., the 1 & 1/2 cups per day is what we feed them plus veggies, and they are very healthy). However, if this amount is producing an overweight pig, then you should reduce the amount of pellets, and if this guideline is producing a pig that's too thin, increase the amount of pellets. *(Editor's note: my 275-pound potbellied pig gets 1 cup pig pellets in the morning and 1 cup pig pellets in the evening, but he gets quite a few Apple Smacks per day; since he is 20 years old and Apple Smacks are his incentive to get up and walk around for exercise, he will walk anywhere to follow a trail of Apple Smacks ☺)*

Pigs are like people, not all of them are the same. We have two pigs and Stuart is five years old and a normal potbellied pig size and weight, but Bella who is 4 years old, is tall, long and lean (she can still fit through the doggie door). They both get the same amount of food at mealtimes, but Bella gets extra snacks throughout the day.

In addition to the pig pellets, they love a variety of vegetables and fruits. Starchy vegetables such as potatoes, should be fed in moderation and fruits too, because of the high sugar content.

I know it's fun to feed our pigs treats because they love them, but watch the salt content of the treats. Pigs don't have sweat glands so they can't get rid of the salt in their bodies. Just about the only treat we give our pigs is "Apple Smacks," and they will follow you anywhere for one of these. It's actually a horse treat (found at most feed stores), and we cut them in half so they are not getting a lot of calories. They love them.

This is a diet summary that I found on a website called "Potbellied Pig Diet Options" and it's written by a vet.

1. Feed a diet specifically made for Pot Belly pigs.
2. Do not overfeed - pigs will eat whatever you put in front of them.
3. DO NOT feed dog or cat food (too high in protein).
4. Avoid fatty foods, particularly animal fats.
5. Absolutely avoid chocolate and salty snacks.
6. Make sure plenty of fresh water is always available.
7. Do not give into begging or your pig is likely to become a pest and beg constantly (I can attest to that, thank you Curt).
8. Do not feed directly from the fridge, or your pig may quickly become an expert in opening the fridge. (Esther of Estherthewonderpig.com tore the freezer door right off the refrigerator... of course she's a full-grown farm pig... (Esther The Wonder Pig) watch her on Facebook everyday... she is so funny ([see page 13](#) for pictures of Esther!).

Just a friendly reminder to all of you SCAMPP members who live locally, this Saturday, Sept 12, is the pool party at Val's house and it's potluck so bring a dish to share. Medical Question of the Month

Intestinal Worms in Pigs ~ by Dr. T. Ron Vered, DVM

We had a question about what worms are generally found to be parasites of pigs and what is their significance in pet pigs. Also, readers were wondering at what times and frequency pet pigs should be dewormed.

The following table summarizes the information about the more common worms that affect swine, the intermediate hosts that carry them, and the mode pigs get infected by them.

As noted in the table, piglets can get infected with worms from their mother and through ingesting infected feces, where some parasites can be acquired through the skin or from eating infected worms, insects, contaminated grass and even from eating affected meat and human excrement.

The most important way to keep animals free of parasites is to prevent possible exposure to infection. Knowing and understanding the life cycle of the worms gives us the best tools to avoid infection. Keeping the pet's environment clean and dry, picking up fecal material often, controlling plant levels, insects, snails, worms, and rodent numbers are some easy, but very important measures to reduce the risk of pigs getting worms. Keeping water clean, not feeding raw meats and any non-processed human food and animal by products are other safety measures.

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Medical Question of the Month

Intestinal Worms in Pigs ~ by Dr. T. Ron Vered, DVM ~ continued

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When getting any new pets, they should always be checked by a veterinarian for general health and the presence for any external and internal parasites. If any are present, appropriate treatment should be done and the animal should be isolated from the other pets until it is found to be free of infection. The area where it stayed should be de-contaminated by appropriate means before any other pigs are allowed there again.

In general, the timing of worming and the products used should be based on appropriate diagnostic tests and what parasites are found in the pig. Most common worms can be diagnosed through testing the pig's feces and looking for the worm's eggs in the stool. Most veterinary clinics can do those tests or will send the samples to a lab to perform the test. Some parasites may require further testing and if those are suspected, the veterinarian will recommend the needed tests and samples required.

Even under the best conditions, piglets often have worms as they can get them from the mother's milk or even while in the uterus. Therefore; many veterinarians recommend to deworm baby pigs a few times in their first 2-3 months of life even if they do not test them for worms. Later in life, pet pigs are not generally highly exposed to parasites, so we usually recommend to do yearly fecal exams and deworm only if worms are present. If exposure to possible parasitic infection is suspected during any other times, fecal exams should be done and the necessary dewormer and environmental treatment measures should be used. Some veterinarians recommend to deworm pet pigs once or twice a year. They feel that sometimes tests do not detect all parasitic infections and they rather be on the safe side, specially since some of the swine parasites can cause problems in people.

Dewormers for pigs mostly come in oral and injectable forms. Some products which are made for other species (like horses, dogs, cattle) come in liquids and paste form and can be adjusted to be used in potbellied pigs. However; a veterinarian should always be consulted on the dose and route of administration. The important point is to use the appropriate drug for the type of worm, use the full dose, and follow all the administration instructions as some worms require repeated treatments at very specific interval and times.

The scope of this article is too limited for me to go over all available anti-parasitic drugs, but since there was a question about the use of Ivermectin in pigs, I will make the following comment about it. Ivermectins are drugs that kill a broad spectrum of round worms, certain insects and arachnids. The only forms of them labeled for use in pigs are injectables, but oral and topical forms of the drug is made for use in other animals. They can be used in pigs, but dose adjustment is needed as the dose for pigs is different from the one used for horses and cows. Ivermectins, when used correctly, will kill pig mites and lice and are used to both deworm and treat those infections in pigs .

I hope the above information is helpful, and please let me know if there are any further questions or comments. ~ by T. Ron Vered, DVM

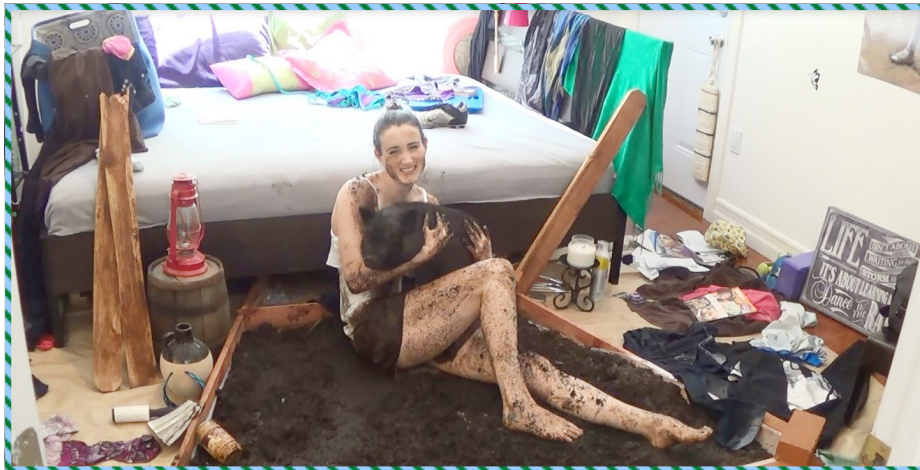
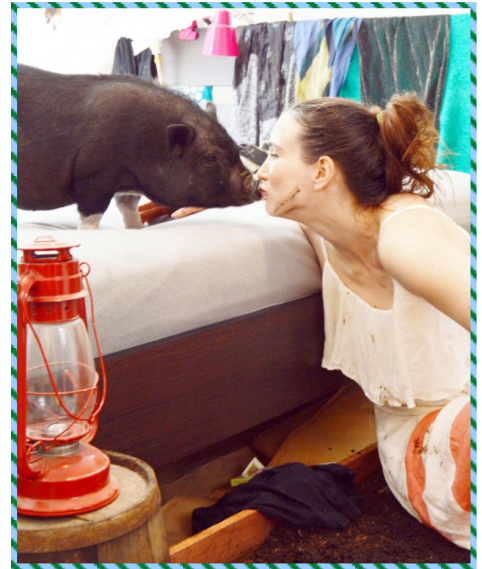
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Mushu's Photo Shoot

On a very cold Las Vegas January day in 2009, Janice, the founder of Windy's, went to the local pig production farm where a ride past the farrowing pens produced the vision of one tiny nearly frozen day-old piglet who was extremely sick. Janice asked to take the piglet home where the piglet could die warm and in peace. This piglet had other ideas... Janice named this tiny little piglet Peppermint Patty, the dog you see in the background is named Joey and she helped save this little pig's life. Because Patty grew very large, very fast she had to leave the house Janice lived in, and moved to a ranch an hour away; Janice's heart was broken without the sounds of a pig in the house. A friend sent an ad on Craigslist for a free pig to a good home; Janice packed up Joey and they went to get Andrew Jackson. We still believe today that Peppermint Patty is the most amazing farm pig who has ever lived and Andrew Jackson is without question the smartest and most unique pot bellied who has ever been loved by a girl.

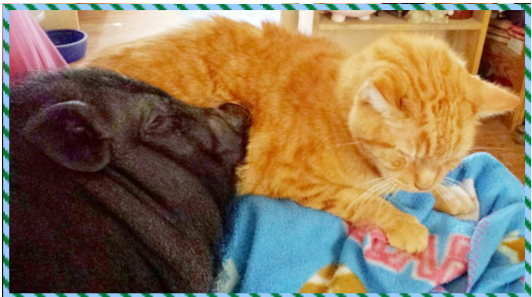
