Hello SCAMPP family and friends.

I hope this finds you all well and safe. I know it has been a long time since we have sent out a newsletter. 2020 was a difficult year for my family. It was full of life changing events. The Pandemic has forever changed most of us and at times it seems as if some are barely able to keep their heads above water. In May of 2020, I lost my father followed 4 weeks later with the loss of my cat, 2 weeks after, my uncle passed and just last week the loss of my dog. I am blessed to have my parents live across the street from me and I am grateful that my daughter and I can be so near my mom as we all try to figure out our new "normal". Working as a nurse during this last year has been humbling. I have a newfound respect for my coworkers and value what every one of them has contributed this last year. The days were long and at times never ending. The one constant thing that did NOT change was the number of pigs that were still needing to be re-homed or dumped in shelters.

We are currently in crises mode. All rescues and sanctuaries have been hit hard and all are at maximum capacity. The Pandemic has taken a toll on so many families and has left so many out of work. The rescues and sanctuaries are not only out of space, but they are also out of resources and the donations are just not as they had been previous years. Pigs are coming into the shelters at alarming rates and little time is being given to place these pigs. As soon as the stray hold has expired, their time is up, and they are immediately red-listed. On the rare occasion that a spot does open for placement, the funds are just not available. I am blessed to be able to network with a very dedicated group of people that have somehow managed to pull off some amazing rescues and placements. SCAMPP will continue to help where we are able to do so, thanks to all of you that have renewed your memberships and donated. You are appreciated. Your donations covered the entire costs for 6 piglets that somehow were abandoned in a backyard to be spayed and neutered (see article on page 13)! That is truly awesome. We could not possible do what we do without all our SCAMPP members. It takes a village.



As things continue to settle down and we all adjust to our new normal, I look forward to resuming some of our SCAMPP activities. I know we all missed the annual Pigma's Party. Peggy has always done such an amazing job. We did hold our annual elections virtually this year and would like to welcome our two new additions to our 2021 SCAMPP board; long-time member, Tori Pierce and the return of previous board member/President, Karrie (KC) Casada. Since SCAMPP is a non-profit organization, SCAMPP is required to prepare an Annual Year-End Financial Report and notify the membership of the financial status of the organization via our Annual Year-End Financial Report. In addition, per our bylaws, any member shall have the right to inspect the books and records at any time, upon written request. To your left on this page, are the total income and expenses during the year 2020, ending Dec. 31, 2020.

In the past, SCAMPP has done up to 24 events per year. But, over the last few years, our number of events have been reduced from 7-13 events per year due to many of our major annual events being canceled.

However, the number of events during 2020 was totally different, with only 2 events, due to the Corona Virus Pandemic and Shutdown! The Mary S. Roberts Pet Adoption Center's Summer and Winter Animal Kids Camps are the only 2 events we did last year and those were done via remote video.

Our events are important because they allow our SCAMPP members to mingle with the public to promote SCAMPP and encourage membership in SCAMPP, to educate the public about the proper needs & care of potbellied pigs, to promote adoption of potbellied pigs, to raise donations to help with rescue, transport & medical needs of rescued potbellied pigs, and to allow the public to see and touch potbellied pigs and experience the fact that these precious pigs can be great pets.

Financially, last year, due to very little public exposure, less income in donations that would have come from events, along with not being able to hold our Christmas Party that helps by bringing in funds from our Annual Christmas Party Fundraiser, SCAMPP's annual income was quite a bit lower than in years past. However, SCAMPP's annual expenses were quite a bit lower due to less spent on newsletter printing and less spent on event expenses, but our ending bank balance was increased slightly from the previous year.

Animal Kids Camp is day camp for kids who love animals. The Mary S. Roberts Pet Adoption Center in Riverside, CA offers camp in the summer and during the local winter and spring breaks. If your kids want to spend time with animals and learn even more about them, this camp is for them! Kids spend hands-on time with the pet adoption center's cats, dogs, puppies, and kittens. Kids learn fun and new facts about all kinds of animals. Kids also partici-

participate in animal-themed crafts, activities, and games. Kids hear from fantastic guest speakers who work with animals. And kids make new friends who love what they love - the animals, of course! Animal Kids Camp's goal is to provide a camp experience that is educational, fun, and safe. Due to Covid-19 during this December of 2020 Winter Camp, campers were limited to a cohort of 14 campers, continuing their already vigorous cleaning protocol, frequent sanitizing & handwashing, and social distancing when possible. Staff, volunteers, presenters, and campers were required to wear face coverings at all times except during snack and lunch time.

On Wednesday, Dec. 30, 2020, SCAMPP participated in a virtual (video) presentation to the kids at The Mary S. Roberts Pet Adoption Center in Riverside, CA, for their Winter Animal Kids Camp program. SCAMPP member and treasurer, Megan, led a Pig Painting lesson from her home. Em Atwood conducted a virtual tour and showed the kids what it was like to live with 4 indoor pigs, and Jody, our secretary answered all questions and showed off all the tricks Gunnar and Baron have learned. We know the kids miss having the pigs visit in person as we always did before Covid-19, but they seemed to really enjoy the painting session and see the video how the pigs actually live at home. ~ continued next page ~

When my girlfriend (now my wife), decided it was time for us to take the next step in our relationship and move in together, I responded as all men do when confronted with this monumental question: "Okay, but I'm getting a pig". The first day we brought our first pig, Panda, home I came to realize was one of the best days of my life. We picked him up from the airport. He was tiny (about 12 pounds), had pooped in his crate, and sporadically oinked as we drove him home. He was understandably scared, but ate out of my hand. That night my wife worried that Panda was too big of an undertaking, that we could not take care of a pig. I, however, was confident. Over the next few weeks, I bonded with Panda. I brought him to work as many days as possible so that he was rarely alone. He explored the office, met and bonded with my coworkers and sometimes even snuck a nap or two when we could.

He tipped over trash cans and stole food. I was in love.

Soon after we adopted Panda, I started thinking about us adopting a second pig. I desperately wanted to rescue a pig because there were so many in shelters and I thought it would be good for Panda to have company. We reached out to Saving Animals and Healing Hearts and waited to hear on a pig in need of a home.


On a warm Saturday afternoon, Becky Atwood of SCAMPP brought Morty to our home. She told us that he was rescued from a home where he was left on the porch. The poor boy had never seen grass and possibly did not have enough to eat. When we unloaded him from the car he was scared to walk on the grass and tiptoed carefully around our yard. We bathed him, introduced him to his new bed and his home. Eventually, he got comfortable, and then he saw Panda (in his pig pen). They growled at each other, stared at each other and pooped. A sibling rivalry was born that exists to this day.

Over the next few weeks, as Morty tried to acclimate to his new surroundings, I noticed that when I would play and cuddle with Panda, Morty would watch from a distance. It was then I realized that Morty desperately wanted to be loved, but was afraid to open up to us. My wife and I spent extra time with Morty to make sure he felt loved and safe, too. On the day we moved into our new home, we moved Panda first into the new house. We brought in Morty in the second ten-minute trip to the house that same day. Morty laid on my lap in the back seat of the car, tears rolling from his eyes. My wife and I believe that this was due to Morty being passed from home to home (we think we were his third or fourth home), and he was scared to be abandoned again. Our hearts swelled thinking of Morty's past trauma but also knowing he was with his forever home.

Morty and Panda have thrived during the pandemic as my wife and I each work remotely from home. Typically, Morty and Panda (who still do not get along) fight over who gets to lay at my feet while I work, and who gets to be at my feet when I watch television. Every day I wake up to those two faces and make sure they know how loved they are. Panda and Morty made this pandemic bearable and when I look at them my heart surges with love. I could not imagine my life without Panda and Morty. They may misbehave at times, tip their water bowls, and dig up my grass, but when I look into their sweet eyes, I know it is all worth it. ♥ ~ by Alan Cooper





In July last year (2020), my husband and I made a trip to Florida to look into moving there. We didn't like any of the homes we saw, so we ended up buying land with plans of having my husband's brother build us a brand new home. My husband's brother has been a home builder for over 30 years and lives in Punta Gorda, Florida. We purchased land in Port Charlotte just about 10-15 minutes from where his brother lives. So, in September last year (2020), we packed up and moved to Port Charlotte, Florida. It was hard for me since I'd been very involved in SCAMPP for almost 30 years, I also served at the same church for over 40 years in Children's Ministry teaching Sunday School every Sunday, and my husband and I were very involved in helping Southern Gospel artists during their concerts helping with loading/unloading their equipment, set-up and tear-down of their equipment, product tables, and PR of their concerts. However, in March 2020, everything shut down and/or canceled due to the Corona-

Virus, which made it easier for me to agree to move. We sold or gave away almost all our furniture and appliances and threw out so much stuff that had accumulated over the past 20-40 years, and left with only one moving van. We are renting a great fully-furnished rental home while submitting all the paperwork (architectural drawings, permits, etc) awaiting to clear the land to start building. The land (1 and 1/4 acres) is nothing but trees, trees, and more trees.

Well, we have been in Florida since September 2020. It is now February 2021 and we just got the final permits all approved to start clearing the land to start building! It will take 6-8 months to build the home and be able to move into. In the meantime, we have been very busy planning, shopping, and picking out all new furniture, appliances, flooring, countertops, shower and tile colors/designs, and a ton of other fixtures that most people generally take for granted, but we will need EVERYTHING since we are starting from scratch. The home will be more than double the size of our California house, plus my husband will have a separate 2400 sq. ft. garage/workshop. You may wonder why do just the two of us need such a big house since we have no kids - well, we do still support our California gospel singing artists and want to have room for them (and friends) to stay if/when they come to Florida to visit/sing (will also need RV & Bus parking). We have also been very busy attending our Southern Gospel & Country Gospel concerts out here (sometimes 3-4 concerts per week). We did not have any family out in California, but my husband and I both have family members out here. We love the weather out here and being near the

water. We have no animals because there is quite a bit of wildlife out here. None of the wildlife has bothered us, but since we are renting, we cannot have animals at our rental. And no, we haven't had any encounters with alligators yet. There are wild hogs in many areas, which I feel sorry for, but I won't bring any home for pets ☺! We quickly built separate enclosures for the boys and girls as I was informed that they could get already become pregnant at their age. We immediately accepted full responsibility without hesitation and began the journey to responsibly caring for these new additions. These piggies deserved to be properly taken care of and shown the love that our other pigs got daily. They quickly went from eight frightened piglets to affectionate little members of the family. Fast forward to December 30th. I received a message from Brittney Whisel, from Penelope's Purpose - Pot-Bellied Pig Rescue & Sanctuary. Brittany had previously blessed me with a bonded pair from her rescue. She has given me great advice and also pointed me in the direction of a lady who was interested in adopting one of the piggies. I made the call to this amazing lady, Sally. Sally came with her husband to meet the piggies and adopted our very chunky little girl, which she named Dottie.

Our communication didn't end there. Sally became invested in helping me along to find homes for the piggies. But first, they all needed to be spayed/neutered.

Along came SCAMPP!!! My first phone call was from Karrie. She inquired about the piggies story and the ball was rolling. Sally was involved with this amazing organization in the past and must have had a feeling that they would be a good fit for this situation. Karrie then put me in touch with Jody. Now the lines of communication were open with SCAMPP and the piggies lives were headed in the right direction.

I made some calls to get information on the spay/neuters and the best price and recommended vet happened to be in Jurupa Valley, at Pedley Square Veterinary Clinic. Jody informed me that SCAMPP would like to step in and pay for the piggies to be spayed/neutered. WOW!!!! All I had to do is make the appointment and transport them to the vet.

I made the appointments, 3 piggies at a time, two weeks in a row. Up at 4:30am to make the trip with sleepy piggies to Riverside from San Diego.

We are so grateful for the amazing communication and treatment that was provided by SCAMPP. They went over and above what they pledged for the care and treatment of these "dumped" piggies. The entire bill paid for all six pigs.

I can't thank SCAMPP enough for everything they have done. It was such a relief to have all of you rally behind the care of these pigs. Thank you Jody, Karrie and Becky and all of the SCAMPP members and supporters for all you have done. Oh, and a special thanks to Karrie for her more than generous donation. The pig community is blessed to have you. It takes a village!!!! SCAMPP made my mission their own. My promise to SCAMPP will be to bring more members who share the same goals. We both want to spread awareness to the community about the importance of care and spaying and neutering these low riders.
