hand to cover the event and interview adopters for live TV. We were able to educate and present visitors with information on adopting potbellied pigs. It was a great success as I was told by workers that all small dogs were adopted out, many large ones and cats too! And for the icing on the cake- we were able to save a shelter pig that day!! Thank you Peggy W. for inquiring to see if there were any pigs at the shelter. Once informed, Becky and I went into action while the other ladies held down the SCAMPP area.

I searched for someone in charge and was told they'd send someone. About 30 minutes later, the supervisor showed up at our booth. We walked over to barn area together. The smell and flies were really horrid. I mentioned again I was with SCAMPP and that we could possibly rescue. I voiced my concerns and asked if the pig could be moved into another area. I was told that pigs like filth and that he was an escape artist so that's why he was locked up. I politely mentioned that pigs are actually clean animals, have a keen sense of smell; but yes, they do like a mud hole to cool them down. As we walked away, he then said if I'd find him a foster, he'd make sure the pig would be released today...

Becky and I then went over to visit the pig in the 8X8 box stall. I noticed it was latched but not locked and the pig was lying in the corner surrounded in filth. "Shelter pig" was very shy and uncertain. The tag on the door stated brown female , 1-year old. We immediately realized that "she" was definitely ... ALL boy! He was indeed white and had the most precious eyes. It took "Shelter Boy" all of about a minute to warm up to me, even flopping for a belly rub. Becky then immediately reached out to our local members that transport and awhile later a foster came through! Thank you SCAMPP members Yolanda and daughter for volunteering to drive here, and then all that way! I went home to pick up a crate and arrived back at the shelter at closing time (this was on a Saturday and they are closed on Sundays so we wanted to do it that day!). They stayed open to let us both back in and helped to corner him into the crate. Shortly, "Shelter boy" was on his way to the "Saving Animals and Healing Hearts, Inc. Rescue"! Thank you Teri! He looked so defeated when he left, but his new life was just beginning and going to be filled with love! I went back inside and filled out his re-

lease papers.

We had the perfect booth set-up at the Riverside loca-

tion, thanks to Peggy, Rita, Beth', and Beth's niece! Thank you Becky for bringing beautiful Miss Tootsie, who enjoyed grazing in her grass area pen, and had many visitors that day that asked a ton of questions! It's so awesome to be able to educate the public about this beautiful breed of piggies and how amazed some are of their intelligence. We also shared about the desperate need to "Adopt Instead of Shop". Even if it's only one pig at a time, it's still a difference for that pig.

Laura did an excellent presentation of educating us on topics such as Harness Training, Leash Walking, Handling Issues (like during Hoof Trimming & Vet Visits), Aggression, Tricks, Ramp Training (getting in and out of vehicle), Housetraining, Whining/Squealing and other topics during question & answer sessions. And it has only been a few months since he's been on the platform so imagine what would happen if a year or more went by, and instead of needing him to jump onto a platform the situation was getting him up a ramp into the car? In addition to handling and safety behaviors, it would be great to have some suggestions for fun things you want your pigs to learn so we can be sure to cover the things that are important to you.
